
Having grown out of the well-established Rosetta Art Centre (RAC), we are a fully functioning visual art centre, which includes a pottery studio, a darkroom, a printmaking and painting room and a photography studio. In 2015 we opened The Humble Gallery, named after our founder Yvonne Humble, which is dedicated to showcasing work from early stage and emerging artists in east London, with a core focus on Newham, and helping those artists to earn from their work.

We are proud to be in a dynamic and diverse part of the world, delivering exciting, innovative and creative courses, workshops and experiences for people in east London, reaching those who otherwise have little access to the rich and transformative benefits of the arts and of education. At the heart of our programming there is something for all ages and stages of a person's creative learning and development. Working across gender, disability, age and income, we respond to poverty and inequality by acting as a catalyst for creative talent.

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



How we work

Artists who work with us receive in-house training to support the delivery of participatory teaching for the communities we work with. Our pool of artist educators are highly specialised in their choice of creative practises, supported by a wealth of experience and qualifications.

Our commitment to working closely with diverse group within our communities was recognised in 2018 by a <u>National Diversity Award nomination</u> for a Community Organisation Award for Race, Religion and Faith. And for two consecutive years we have also been nominated by <u>Artskickers</u>.



Working together

We have 25 years of experience in delivering creative art projects with the communities of east London.

Working in a spirit of collaboration, we engage local communities and venues, discovering and supporting artists at different stages of their artistic development. By creating dynamic partnerships with a range of local, national and international arts organisations, we generate opportunities for those who otherwise have little access to the transformative benefits of the arts.

Our supportive networks and safe spaces allow children and young people to experiment and recognise their artistic potential. We are recognised locally and



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nationally for delivering bold and ambitious participatory arts practice, both, ensure our interventions of the highest quality

Who we work with

We offer residents from all walks of life, a chance to live the life they choose in a borough with one of the highest unemployment (8.6%) and child poverty rates (41%) in London.

Key Stats

- Over 50% of our Centre's capacity is occupied by women
- we work with 72% BAME;*
- over 80% are income assisted
- 27% are disabled


From 2015-2018, we have:

- Introduced over 155,000 new people to visual arts
- Worked with 514 artists, of which 64% were BAME*

Directly working with:

- 45 young people with mental health issues
- 380 elderly people
- Over 320 children on school dinners
- Disabled adults who make up 27% of our beneficiaries


Your donations help us bring engaging courses, creative workshops and innovative participatory art experiences to people across east London.
